



Biography - Glen Ample

Glen Ample is an Austrian hard rock band formed in January 2020 by singer/bassist Gabe and guitarist Dany T. The two met at a concert of Dany's cover band. The gig was followed by a spontaneous jam session, where the idea to start a new band project was born.

Their genre is very diverse, as classic rock, stoner, hard rock, as well as modern progressive metal influences can be found in their songs. After a while they found Canadian drummer Matt Hain, who stood out with his accomplished playing style, thus completing the trio.

Singer Gabe, who is also a trained gardener, stumbled by chance upon the label of a raspberry variety of the same name "Glen Ample". And thus the band name was quickly decided.

After a short time they wrote and recorded their first songs "Don't Kill", "Midnight" and "Killer Machine" in the studio. With their fat sound and the distinctive voice of frontman Gabe, they got a lot of attention in the music industry after a short time. Their songs, for example "Don't Kill", are already playing on the radio in different countries. (Brazil, Canada, USA, England, Austria, Germany u.v.m....) In October 2020 also the ORF became aware of the band and dedicated Glen Ample a contribution in the evening program.

In print media such as the "Kleine Zeitung" and the "Woche", the rock band has already made headlines where they are also called "the Hopeful rock band of Styria" were titled.

In February 2021 Glen Ample released their first EP "Don't Kill Rock'n'Roll, which also appeared as vinyl on the market.

After the successful release and numerous feedbacks from various rock and metal magazines, the EP was also sampled on the German market through the promotion agency "Medialuchs", where the band had good success. Such as interviews at Rockantenne, airplay's and rotation's at several German stations.

In 2021 Glen Ample could record some live gigs as well as their first livestream show despite the Corona Pandemic!

In 2022 the rock trio could finally really take off in the course of their "Don't Kill Rock'n Roll" tour and played over 17 shows in almost all Austrian provinces. Some of the highlights were also well-known festivals such as Nova Rock Festival, Iron Road for Children, Heavy Mölltal, Burning Stone and many more.

In January 2023 drummer Matt Hain left the band due to time constraints and was replaced by their current drummer "March Potnik". Since February 2023 they are working on their first album "Living in Desire" which will be released in autumn 2023.
